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## Fire Island Hosta

### Class Description:

Join our Certified Shop Instructor in creating this stunning quilt. Classes will be held once a month for 8 months. Fire Island Hosta includes Judy Niemeyer's curved-line paper piecing technique. This class is perfect for the confident beginning to advanced quilter. (Student must know how to use their machine and how to rotary cut fabric.)

Supplies: *Bring the following to class or purchase at Quilter's Corner with your class discount of 15%*

- Fire Island Hosta Pattern
- Fabric according to the directions
- Sewing machine in good working order
- Open toe foot
- ¼" quilting foot
- Bottom Line 60 wt. thread
- Microtex Machine needles, size 70/10
- Individual Steam Iron or seam roller
- Small Ironing Board/Mat (*optional*)
- Add-a-Quarter Ruler: 12" recommended, 6" and or 18" optional
- Ruler - 6" x 12" ruler and 8 ½" x 24
- Purple Thang
- Scissors
- Pins - Flat head flower pins
- Seam ripper
- Pencil
- Rotary cutter - 45mm or 60 mm (**with new blade**)
- Medium size cutting mat (18" x 24")
- Glue Pen (Fons and Porter, Sewline, or Bohn recommended)
- Scotch Tape
- Large & Small Ziploc Bags
- Stapler
- Binder Clips
- Large Paper Clips (box)

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*Payment for classes and events is required at time of registration. Preparation for Class:

1. **Check the website <http://www.quiltworx.com/corrections/> for any revisions to your pattern.**
2. Read your pattern as if you are reading a magazine.
3. Read it again. (Really!)
4. Label 8 large ziplock bags #1- #8.
5. Leaving 1/8" beyond the outside cutting line, trim away excess newsprint paper (NP) from the Foundation Papers.
6. Paper-clip the units together and place in the appropriately numbered ziplock bags – see pattern instructions/diagrams.
7. Cut the Template Papers (TP) **ON** the dark solid line that forms a box around each group or individual template.
8. Sort the Template Papers (TP) and place into the appropriate ziplock bags – see pattern instructions/diagrams.

If you get confused with the prework, **STOP!** Read your pattern again. Do not cut unless you understand the directions.

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
